**Books and Pamphlets:** Author. Title. Edition. Place of publication: Publisher, Copyright date.

#### **ONE AUTHOR:**

Flexner, James Thomas. American Painting. Rev. ed. Boston: Houghton, 1950.

#### **2 OR 3 AUTHORS:**

Bebhardt, Richard C., and Dawn Rodrigues. Writing: Processes and Intentions. 2nd ed. Lexington: Heath, 1989.

#### **FOUR OR MORE AUTHORS:**

Mussen, Paul, et al. Psychology. 3rd ed. Lexington: Heath, 1973.

#### **ENCYCLOPEDIA or DICTIONARY ARTICLE:**

Little, Donald P. "Circassians." Dictionary of the Middle Ages. New York: Scribner's, 1983.

(For very well-known encyclopedias, you don't have to have full publishing info. See below:)

"Ojibwa Indians." Encyclopedia Britannica. 15<sup>th</sup> ed. 1997.

**Magazine / Newspaper / Journal Articles:** Author. "Title of article." Title of Journal Date or Volume#.Issue#: page #s.
