



Emergency Medical Services

UCC's Emergency Medical Services (EMS) program provides career training for entry-level positions in emergency medical settings. Ambulance companies, fire and police departments, and various other industries need well-trained, professional emergency medical personnel.

Successful completion of UCC's EMT, Advanced EMT, EMT-Intermediate, or Paramedic training programs prepares students to take the respective state certification exams. The EMS department also offers continuing education opportunities for first responders and EMS professionals.

Program Length

Full-time students can typically complete the EMS program in two years.

Prerequisites

Because of the medical nature of the training, UCC's EMS program has specialized admission requirements. For example, students must pass a criminal background check and meet immunization requirements.

In addition, students may need to take prerequisite courses to start the program. Contact the EMS program staff to discuss specifics for each individual.

Special Notes

UCC's EMS program boasts a student success rate of 90 percent. Program staff are dedicated to preparing students for positions in the field.

Employment Possibilities

Graduates may be qualified for employment as EMTs, Advanced EMTs, Intermediate EMTs, Paramedics, and Emergency Room Technicians.
