IMPORTANT REMINDERS FOR STUDENTS

- **This is a college course.**
 - Your grade will show up on your permanent college transcript.
 - Your performance in this course may affect your financial aid in the future.
 - If you are unsure how you are doing in the course, talk with your instructor.
 - If you move away or leave this class for any reason, *you must drop the class using UCC's Self Service Banner.*
- **Your UCC student ID number is very important. Save your ID and pin numbers on your phone or keep them in your wallet.**
 - Your student ID number gives you access to your records in the online 'Self Service Banner.'
 - You can also use it to access online or in-person tutoring, to get a student ID at UCC, schedule an appointment with an advisor, use the library, etc.
 - If you are not sure what your pin is, the default is your *six digit birthdate* (ie. May 15th, 1995 =051595)
